

The Consumer Product Safety Commission recently issued the largest recall of drop-side cribs in history. 2.1 million cribs have been recalled. As the seller of your crib, you are responsible to verify that you are not selling a recalled item. Visit www.cpsc.gov to ensure your crib is safe. Below are other safety standards set out by the CPSC that will determine if your crib is sellable. Any crib not meeting these standards cannot be sold at the Little Britches sale. Check off each item below and bring this form to the sale with you for each crib you wish to sell.

Crib Safety Checklist

- ? **Crib Slat width:** Cribs will be accepted if the space between the slats is no more than 2-3/8 inches apart to prevent infants from getting their head stuck between them. Cribs manufactured after 1974 must meet this and other strict safety standards.
- ? **Crib Top Rails:** The top rails of crib sides, in their raised position, should be at least 26 inches above the top of the mattress support at its lowest position.
- ? **Cribs with corner posts:** The corner posts should be the same height as the end panels or less than 1/16 of an inch higher than the end panels.
- ? **Cribs with Cut outs:** No cut-out areas on the headboard or footboard so a baby's head cannot get trapped.
- ? **Wood Cribs:** Wood surfaces must be smooth and free from splinters, splits, cracks, or other defects that might cause a crib or any of its parts to fall off or come apart.
- ? **Checked for recall**
